Thinking Process		Parts of the Summary:
	Identify the larger topic or focus.	Describe the basic topic or focus of a work.
	Every work starts with a general topic or focus.	
	Usually a writer is motivated to say something about this topic, which can be a social issue or debate.	
2.	Identify the main idea.	Then identify the main idea what the author has to say about that topic.
	Every work has, at its core, one main idea.	
	This idea is the thing the author most wants us to understand.	
3.	Map the key points.	And finally list the key points the author offers to develop that main idea.
	Every work is developed in a set of key points.	
	Each of these points is offered because it helps us understand the author's main idea.
